The North Stonington Public Schools has a district goal - Design, document and implement innovative instructional opportunities that empower each learner. We are striving to use the most effective teaching methods in every classroom to achieve increased learning and motivation for every student. This has been the major focus for professional development this school year. To be successful, we must stay up-to-date and implement different teaching strategies.

## Examples include:

- Teaching reading using the three senses of hearing, seeing, and touch simultaneously based on the science of reading
- Empowering students to prepare and conduct debates in Spanish on current issues

- Desmos Math, which allows students to quickly share and respond to each other's thinking

- Reviewing "ways of thinking" (curiosity, growth mindset, planning, etc.) before a new unit
